## **Verbal Irony**


Irony in which a person says or writes one thing and means another, or uses words to convey a meaning that is the opposite of the literal meaning.

## **Examples:**

- Soft like a brick
- Hard as putty
- Clear as mud
- As pleasant as surgery
- Saying "Oh, fantastic!" when the situation is actually very poor
- As calm as a dog in heat
- As sunny as a winter day in Vancouver
- This chair is as comfortable as sitting on nails.
- I enjoyed the movie as much as getting a root canal.
- The steak was as tender as a leather boot.
- I like spending time with my co-workers as much as I enjoy digging my eye out with a dull spoon.
